PREPARING FOR YOUR ARRIVAL

Here are some useful tips to help you settle into university life in Lyon and to prepare you for your transition into French life and culture.

FINANCING YOUR TRIP

PREPARING YOUR BUDGET

To live comfortably in Lyon, you should budget to spend around **600€ to 800€** a month on rent, food and social activities. When you arrive, expect to pay around **1,500€** for your first month to cover initial costs such as your deposit, rent and electricity and water bills.

OPENING A FRENCH BANK ACCOUNT

It is a good idea to open a French bank account when you arrive in France as it will allow you to:

- Have a credit card and cheque book, which are useful means of payment
- Have a bank account number known as a "Relevé d'Identité Bancaire" (RIB) which you will need to receive reimbursements
- Receive automatic payment, rent assistance or medical reimbursement payments into your account
- Pay for rent, electricity, gas and other day-to-day expenses
- Withdraw cash

The welcome team will be able to give you some guidance

Ask your current bank for their IBAN (International Bank Account Number). You will need this to transfer money into your French bank account.

RESIDENCE PERMIT

If you are not from a country in the European Economic Area, you will need to apply for a Student Long Stay Visa. The letter of acceptance from Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University will need to be submitted with your visa application to the French Consulate in your country. (Please note that visas can take several weeks to be issued).

In France:

- **Long Stay Visa, with working permit:** students will have to go through the OFII* procedure within the first three months of their stay in France. See contact details below.
- **Long Stay Visa, with residence card:** students will have to go through the OFII* procedure to apply for their residence card within the first two months of their stay in France. See contact details below.
- **Long Stay Visa for minors:** students will have to go to the Prefecture to apply for their residence card. This process can take up to two months.

- **Long Stay Visa, with temporary residence permit exemptions:** students are not required to do anything when they arrive in France.

INSURANCE AND HEALTH

SOCIAL SECURITY

European exchange students

Students already covered by their country's social security should obtain the **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** from their social security services provider before coming to France. This card ensures that students have health insurance in Europe, and also includes health cover for trips within the European Economic Area or Switzerland.

Non-European exchange students, European students living outside of Europe or non-exchange students

Students are registered under the social security scheme as soon as they have enrolled in a tertiary education program.

There are two bodies that govern student social security (compulsory) and health insurance (optional), including: LMDE (www.lmde.com) and SMERRA (www.smerra.fr). Students are required to pay 207€ (price for 2012-2013) when they enrol or first arrive at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University. (Please note: American Express cards are not accepted).

As soon as you are enrolled, you will receive a certificate from social security. Keep this in a safe place as you may need it throughout your stay.

NB: *students over 28 years of age do not fall under the same social security system. For more information, please visit the International Relations Office.*

Health Insurance: social security does not completely reimburse medical costs, however you can choose to pay for additional health insurance that reimburses all medical expenses.

LIABILITY INSURANCE (ASSURANCE RESPONSABILITÉ CIVILE)

This insurance covers personal injuries or damage to property that may have been caused by you and is mainly encouraged for students who participate in sports. All foreign students have to provide the university with proof of liability insurance before their enrolment can be validated (see *housing insurance on page 23*).

LYON 3 HEALTH CARE SERVICES

The Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University Health Care and Health Promotion facilities offer students a range of free services:

- Medical appointments
- General consultations for medical advice, certificates attesting the ability to practise sport, certificates for CROUS and work certificates
- Specialist consultations for dietary, psychiatric, psychological, gynaecological and nicotine addiction problems
- Medical Services (no appointment required) that provide first aid and free and anonymous screening. No appointment is required.

HEALTH CARE IN FRANCE

Booking a medical appointment

If you need to make a medical appointment, the the International Relations Office can help you choose the right one.

- **Public medical clinics:** a consultation will cost you 23 €. However, you will be reimbursed up to 70% under the social security scheme.
- **Private medical clinics:** private clinics set their own consultation fees and are not reimbursed under the social security scheme.

If you need to see a doctor, ask if the medical practice is public

How do I get reimbursed for a consultation?

European exchange students

To receive your first reimbursement, you will need to go to the "Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie" (CPAM) with your medical claim form*, your French bank account number "Relevé d'Identité Bancaire" (RIB) and a copy of your European health insurance card. Non-European exchange students, European students living outside of Europe or non-exchange students

After each consultation you will receive a medical claim form* that you will have to fill out, sign and send to your SMERRA or LMDE social security centre. When you first do this, you will need to attach your French bank account number and you will be reimbursed directly into your account.

HOSPITALS

In France, there are public and private hospitals as well as private medical clinics, all of which you can access.

Before your first medical visit, make sure the hospital is public so that you will be reimbursed for your medical expenses.

EMERGENCY

All medical institutions, public or private, can treat patients in emergency situations irrespective of their insurance. However, medical practitioners will evaluate the severity of the situation and whether it should be treated as an emergency or not. It is free to call the following emergency telephone numbers: **General emergencies: 112 | Ambulance (SAMU**): dial 15 | Fire: dial 18 | Police: dial 17.**

PHARMACY

For any minor illnesses, you can visit your local pharmacy. The pharmacists can give you free medical advice and if necessary, they will advise you to consult a doctor.

* A medical claim form known as "feuille de soins" is a document provided by your doctor that will enable you to be reimbursed for your medical expenses.

▣ ACCOMMODATION

Lyon is a large city and finding the right accommodation can sometimes be difficult. It is a good idea to start looking for a place to live before you arrive and, if necessary, book some temporary accommodation until you find something permanent.

There is a variety of accommodation options for you to choose from:

- CROUS university residences
- Private university residences
- Apartments (via real estate agents or private companies)
- Shared houses
- Homestays

Exchange students have access to the Lyon III International Association (see page 44) that provides students with the assistance they need to find accommodation in the CROUS university residences, private residences or with a host family.

There is a service fee of 10€ and further costs are added when making a reservation such as a 20€ application fee and a 305€ deposit (compulsory reservation deposit that will be reimbursed at the end of your stay or deducted from your rent).

HOUSING TAX (TAXE D'HABITATION)

In France, residences are subjected to a housing tax that is calculated according to the amount of rent paid by the student. As a general rule, this amount is around the equivalent of one month's rent, which varies depending on the suburb you live in. This tax is due on the 1 January, the year following the beginning of your tenancy, and therefore you may receive a tax assessment notice once you have returned to your home country.

HOUSING INSURANCE (ASSURANCE HABITATION)

Housing insurance is compulsory in France and therefore students are required to take out housing insurance. It covers public liability insurance that students require to validate their enrolment at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University.

RENT ASSISTANCE (AIDE AU LOGEMENT)

As a student in France you can benefit from receiving rent assistance*. This payment will appear in your account each month, but note that it will take approximately two months for you to start receiving payments.

After having signed your rental contract, you can start your rent assistance application online. You will need to fill out a form, print and send it off along with any other documents required. If you are not a European citizen, you will also have to send a photocopy of both sides of your valid residence permit.

ACCOMMODATION EXPENSES

Fees and charges (*frais de dossier*)

You may be charged a reservation fee for certain residences and apartments. These fees vary between residences and agencies and cover costs related to the management of the property, the inventory of fixtures drawn up upon your arrival and departure, repair work to communal areas etc.

Deposit (*caution*)

You will be required to pay a deposit for your rental property, which will cover any eventual costs relating to damage to the property or unpaid rent. This sum usually amounts to one or two month's worth of rent and should be paid when the contract is signed, before moving into the residence. Your deposit will be given back to you within the two months following your departure and once the inventory of fixtures has been agreed upon.

* If you have a visa with a temporary residence permit exemption you are not eligible to receive rent assistance payments from the CAF.

MOVING IN & MOVING OUT

Landlord (*bailleur*)

Owner of the property

Rental contract and lease (*contrat de location, bail*)

A binding document that outlines the rights and responsibilities of tenants and landlords.

Inventory of fixtures (*états des lieux*)

When you move into your residence you will have to agree upon an inventory of fixtures with the owner or real estate agent. This describes the state of the residence and any eventual property such as dishwashers, furniture etc. The inventory of fixtures should be as precise as possible to avoid any litigation occurring at the end of the tenancy and it must be drawn up upon the arrival and departure of the tenant.

Departure notice (*préavis*)

When it comes time for you to move out, you will need to give your landlord prior departure notice so that he/she can arrange to end your lease. This letter can be sent by registered post and should specify when you intend to leave the residence. Departure notices must be given in advance and their timeframe is subjected to the conditions of the rental contract.

📌 DAILY LIFE IN LYON

FOOD

The French usually have three meals a day: breakfast in the morning, lunch between 12:00pm and 2:00pm and dinner between 7:00pm and 9:00pm.

France, and particularly Lyon, is renowned for its gastronomy. There are many traditional restaurants, locally known as "Bouchons", where you can discover typical Lyonnais cuisine.

There are several places where you can go food shopping in Lyon:

- Local bakeries, butchers etc.
- Small inner-city convenience stores (however they can be more expensive)
- Discount supermarkets located in the city centre and suburbs (affordable prices for students)
- Hypermarkets within large shopping centres, also known as "grandes surfaces" that are usually located on the outskirts of Lyon (affordable prices and a large selection of products)
- There are many food markets in Lyon that sell local produce

Here is an example of the costs of some food items: baguette 0.80€ to 1.50€; 1 litre of milk 0.70€; sandwich from 2.50€; coffee 0.70€ to 1.70€; meal at university restaurant 3.10€.

TELEPHONE AND INTERNET

To call from abroad, you will need to add **00 33** and remove the first 0 from the number you wish to call. For example: to call the number 04 78 78 78 78, dial 00 33 4 78 78 78 78.

Numbers starting with **04 and 09** are landlines.

Numbers starting with **06 and 07** are mobile phones.

If you wish to go on a mobile phone plan, French telephone operators can help you get connected. We advise that you shop around to compare prices and read the terms and conditions.

If you decide not to go on a plan, you can also opt for a pre-paid SIM card.

If you want to combine your Internet, telephone and TV all on the one plan you can do so for a cost of around 20€ to 30€ a month.

Wi-Fi is accessible at all Lyon 3 campuses.

GETTING AROUND

Public transport

The metro, tram and bus systems make it easy to get around Lyon and its suburbs. Students under 28 years of age can subscribe to the "Campus" student pass for 28.10€ per month. Other offers are available such as buying single tickets or tickets in packs of ten, or a weekly pass.

Bikes

A great way to travel around Lyon is by using the "Vélo'v" public bicycles. This bike-hiring system allows you to hire and return bikes 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, from any of the 300 stations in the city. Another bonus about using "Vélo'v" is that the first 30 minutes are free if you get the pass!

📌 ARRIVING AT LYON 3

After arriving in Lyon, one of the first things you should do is go and visit the International Relations Office at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University (see page 50 for how to get there). The welcome desk will give you general information to help you settle in and adjust to your new life. You will also meet your geographical coordinator (see contacts on page 51) who will guide you through the administrative process, including your enrolment, classes etc.

Important | Arrival dates in France

You must arrive in France no later than:

- 3rd September for the 1st semester (autumn: September to January)
- 6th January for the 2nd semester (spring: January to June)

📌 STUDENT CARD

Students can collect their student cards from the International Relations Office if all of their enrolment details have been finalised before their arrival. If your enrolment has not yet been finalised, the staff at the International Relations Office will assist you in your enrolment process.

This multi-services card allows you to:

- have your 7-digit student number on you all the time
- load money onto your card to use at the Crous university restaurants - RU or Bistrot U (see page 45) you can ask the International Relations Office where you can recharge your card.
- borrow books and documents from the university libraries

Login and password

The 7-digit number on your student card is your login that will allow you to connect to the Intranet or Wi-Fi (see page 38). Upon arrival and after you have enrolled, you will be given your password that follows the format of your date of birth DDMMYYYY. For example, 01 January 1990 = 01011990

If you lose your student card, go to the "objets trouvés" on 6 Rue Rollet or the reception desk at one of the other campuses.

HIGHER EDUCATION IN FRANCE

COURSE OUTLINE

The courses that are offered at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University are structured under the European education system and follow the format Bachelor-Masters-PhD.

- Bachelor: 3 years or 6 semesters after secondary school
- Masters: 2 years or 4 semesters after a Bachelor's degree
- PhD: 3 years after a Masters degree

SEMESTERS

All degrees are broken up into semesters (2 semesters: autumn and spring). One semester is equivalent to 30 ECTS* credits.

COURSE UNITS

Semesters are composed of course units called "Unités d'Enseignement"(UE) and you can choose from the following:

- "Unité d'enseignement fondamentales"(UEF): Basic course units (core subjects)
- "Unité d'enseignement complémentaires"(UEC): Additional course units (complementary subjects to UEF units)
- "Unité d'enseignement d'ouverture"(UEO): Advanced course units (initiation or consolidation subjects)

COURSE STRUCTURE

Classes are broken up into lectures known as "Cours Magistraux"(CM), which usually take place in the amphitheatres, and tutorials known as "Travaux Dirigés"(TD), which is when students carry out practical work exercises in smaller groups.

EXAM RESITS

If you failed an exam you have the possibility to resit the exam. Exam resits are planned for the beginning of July, therefore if you are coming to Lyon for a full university year it is a good idea to plan to leave after the exam resit period. Note: The Business School (IAE) and the SELF program do not have an exam resit session.

EXCHANGE STUDENTS

DEUF PROGRAM STUDENTS

DEUF: Diplômes d'Études Universitaires Françaises

This program, which is run entirely in French, is offered to Bachelor and Masters students coming to study at Lyon 3 for a semester or a year. You can choose classes in business administration, philosophy, languages, law, political science, literature, information and communication, history and geography from within the different faculties and schools.

Information Session

Information sessions are compulsory and take place at the beginning of semester. At this session you will receive a list of your tutors that will assist you in choosing courses, logging in online and organising your timetable. You will be informed of the session date when you arrive.

Class Choices

After meeting with your tutor, you can select your classes online via the student Intranet (see page 38). You will have to register your courses on intranet at the beginning of October for 1st semester and the beginning of February for 2nd semester.

SELF PROGRAM STUDENTS

LIBRARY LOANS

The library allows you to borrow up to **10 documents for a period of 14 days**. However, some books can only be borrowed for a maximum of 3 days, including encyclopedias and dictionaries. Journals are only available for on-site browsing.

Documents can be borrowed and renewed at the loan desk or from one of the automatic self-service loan machines.

Overdue library loans will result in students being suspended from borrowing documents from the library. The length of this suspension will depend on how overdue the library loans are. If a book is lost, students will be asked to replace or pay for the book.

VIRTUAL LIBRARY

The Virtual Library allows students to access resources from a variety of disciplines off-campus. Available resources include: catalogues, databases, electronic journals in full-text format, electronic books and theses.

📍 HOW TO GET TO JEAN MOULIN LYON 3 UNIVERSITY

ARRIVING FROM LYON - SAINT-EXUPÉRY AIRPORT

The Rhônexpress tram transports passengers from the Lyon - Saint-Exupéry Airport to the centre of Lyon, next to the Part-Dieu train station, in about 30 minutes. For people aged between 12 and 25, a one-way ticket will cost 11.50€ when purchased online and 12.50€ when purchased from a ticket machine. If you are over the age of 25, tickets will cost you 13.50€ or 15€. (Prices for 2013)
